

Geely, Voltron partner to expand EV charging infrastructure in Indonesia

Mainland Chinese automaker Geely has entered into a strategic partnership with Voltron, Indonesia's electric vehicle charging network provider, to expand the country's EV charging infrastructure. The partnership entails installing EV charging stations across all Geely dealerships in Indonesia.
